

### FROM THE PRESIDENT

From the President

What is your least favorite part of quilting? For many people it is putting the binding on. Personally, I have switched to applying my binding by machine. There are many tutorials on YOUTUBE that can show you how.

Many people will use a decorative stitch for the last step in attaching the binding. The most popular seems to be the multi stitch zig zag (also called the serpentine stitch). Personally, I use a straight stitch, but it can be tricky to keep your straight stitch straight.

I recently learned that you can use a "stitch in the ditch" presser foot for this, if you have one. Here is what one looks like:



It has a "blade" down the middle. You use this as your guide for stitching in the ditch, with your needle in the center position (right behind the blade).

If your machine has the ability to move your needle left or right, you can use this type of presser foot for the final attachment of your binding. Run the blade along the edge of the binding, and position the needle away from the blade, the distance that you want it to be. I have not tried this yet, but plan to do so on my next binding project.
