

Mystery Quilt 2024

Part 2

X Block (the X blocks are made from 4 smaller blocks. We make the smaller blocks first)

Take 5 ½ inch squares of Fabric B and place a 3 inch squares of Fabric A (with the diagonal line) in 2 opposite corners. Sew just a thread's width along diagonal line (sewing on the corner side of the diagonal). Fold and press toward the corner. Check that placement is correct (matching the corner edges). Trim excess fabric from behind.

Place a fabric C square in the corner between the 2 fabric A squares. There will be a small amount of overlap. Sew along the diagonal line across the corner. Repeat to make 48 squares this way. Press toward the corner. Trim excess fabric from the back.

Set 20 of the blocks aside for later.

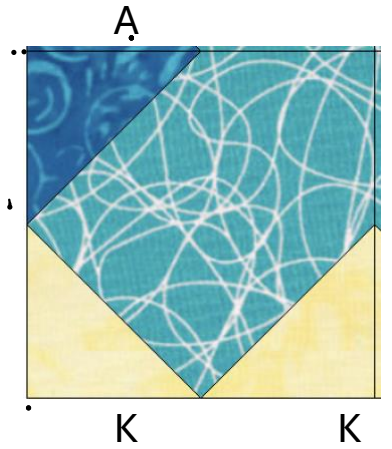


From 28 of these units, make 4 patch blocks, keeping the plain corner(B) in the center. Block should look like a large X with fabric C in all four corners. Make 7 blocks. They should measure 10 ½ inches square.



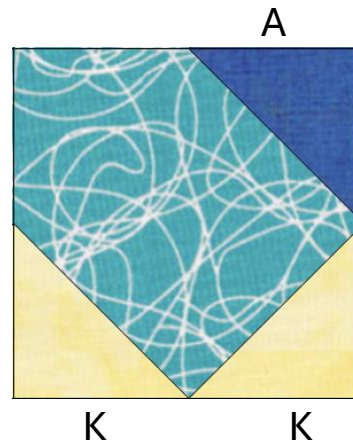
We will call these “X block # 1.”

Make another version of this partial block, using 1 fabric A square and 2 fabric K squares. (You will use 80 of the 3" squares of background that have a diagonal line.)

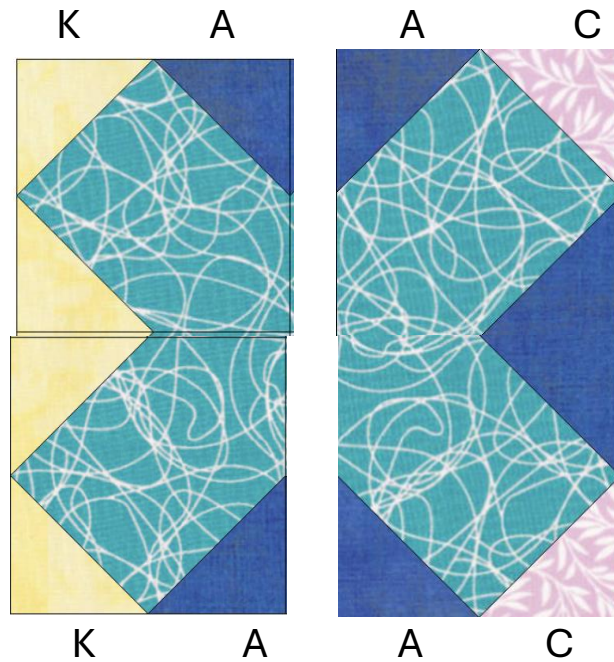


Make 20

Make another version with the A fabric in the other corner, like the diagram below: Make 20.



Make 4 patch blocks using 2 different blocks with K fabric and 2 blocks with the C fabric. Look at the diagram below. Call this “X block # 2”



Make 10 blocks.

Place a safety pin or a clip along the edge of the K triangles to help identify them later.
